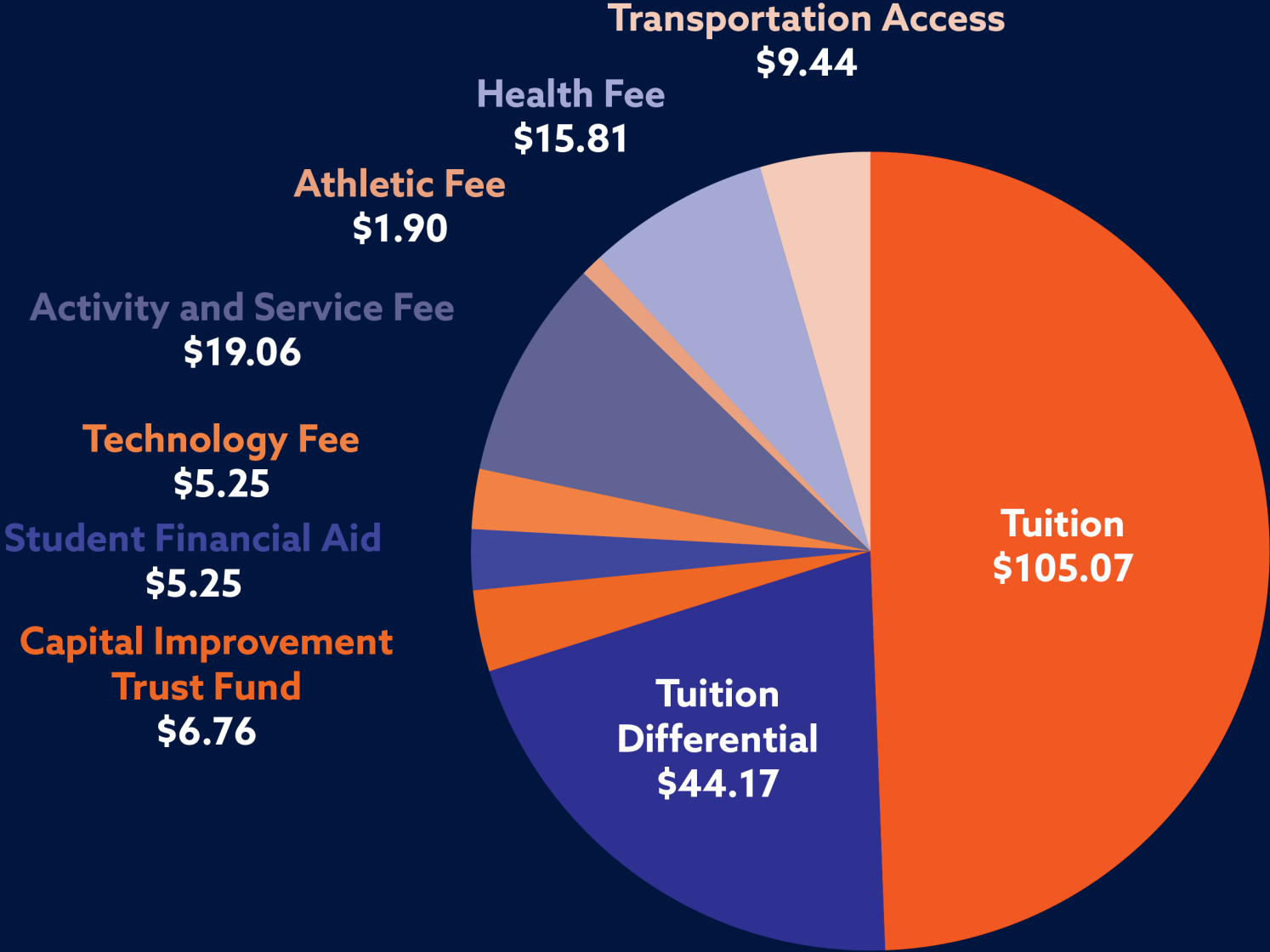


STUDENT FEE BREAKDOWN



ACTIVITY AND SERVICE FEE

The University of Florida has many student groups and student government agencies that provide many opportunities to students. Groups can range from entertainment to informational and networking, but whatever the focus, these student groups need funding. The activity and service fee provides funding for numerous student groups on campus as well as student government agencies such as ACCENT Speaker's Bureau and Student Government Productions. These agencies bring speakers and performers to the University of Florida campus each year for free student shows. The Student Senate allocates the funds that provide for these shows and events each semester.

ATHLETIC FEE

The University of Florida has one of the finest athletic programs in the country and thank to the great Gator Nation we are fortunate to have one of the lowest athletic fees in the state. Revenue from the fee goes to the development and maintenance of athletic facilities and programs.

BUILDING FEE

The Building Fee was set up years ago to fund our beautiful campus. Many of the older on-campus residence halls were constructed with the help of the Building Fee. Today, the Building Fee works to pay off bonds that were used to finance the construction of our expansive and architecturally unique campus.

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT TRUST FUND

The Capital Improvement Trust Fund fee is used to pay for the construction of buildings that enhance the student experience. The revenue from this fee goes to the state capital in Tallahassee where it is invested and allowed to grow. The fee money is then released intermittently and has been used to fund projects including state of the art fitness centers such as Southwest Recreation Center, the Broward Outdoor Complex, the great Reitz Union, and the Counseling and Wellness Center.

FINANCIAL AID FEE

The University of Florida offers many financial aid options to students including grants, scholarships, and loans. The financial aid fee is crucial because much of the financial aid dispersed to students is funded by the University. Under State law, 75% of the revenue from this fee is allocated to students based on absolute need. Revenue from the Financial Aid fee makes a significant impact by giving many under financed students a chance to further their education.

HEALTH FEE

The University of Florida provides health services to students through funding from the Health Fee. By paying the health fee, students are entitled to unlimited infirmary visits each semester with professional staff that offers services similar to any primary care doctor's office. The Student Health Care Center even has its own pharmacy so students can fill prescriptions immediately after being seen by the doctor. Further, the Health Fee funds the Counseling and Wellness Center which provides an outlet for students to receive counseling help from professional staff.

TECHNOLOGY FEE

The technology fee is dedicated to improving the instructional technology provided at the University of Florida. This fee is unique as it does not just implement programs that the administration recommends, but allows for students to input their own ideas. Each year, students can submit "Concept Papers" into a competition in which an advisory board reviews and scores each concept. The students of the selected concept papers are then invited to submit a full Project Proposal to be funded and implemented at UF. In an era in which technological innovations are ever-growing, this fee allows for the University of Florida to maintain high technological capabilities.

TRANSPORTATION ACCESS

The Transportation Access Fee funds all of the student transportation options at UF. Students are encouraged to take advantage of these options as the University has worked hard to provide a wide variety of services. The Regional Transit System (RTS) is a bussing system that provides free bussing to students on and off campus. Further, UF has implemented programs such as the Student Nighttime Auxiliary Patrol (SNAP) for safe nighttime travel, Gotcha Ride, and Zip Car. UF has also allocated funds for the creation of new biking and walking paths. All of these great transit options are funded by the Transportation Access Fee.

TUITION DIFFERENTIAL FEE

Further, 30% of these funds give back to students through financial aid.
