Former FBI agent Gary Aldrich to visit UF

GAINESVILLE, Fla. - Gary Aldrich, former FBI agent specializing in political corruption, will be speaking Monday, October 13 in the University Auditorium at the University of Florida. The event is free and open to the public. Door open at 7:15 PM and the show starts at 8 PM. No large bags or backpacks are permitted.

Gary Aldrich founded the Patrick Henry Center for Individual Liberty in 1997, universally recognized as an effective supporter of the right of ethical dissent. Whistle Blower cases continue to be the Center's strongest effort. The Center was founded after Aldrich served as an FBI agent for 26 years. Aldrich worked within the Reagan, Bush and Clinton administrations and it is generally agreed that he was a driving force in the 1998 impeachment process of President Clinton. With his first book, *Unlimited Access: An FBI Agent Inside the Clinton White House*, he became best known as the FBI agent who broke the code of silence.

The event is co-sponsored by the Florida Frontier and ACCENT Speakers Bureau. The Florida Frontier, UF's conservative newspaper, was founded by a group of University of Florida students who aim to represent the ideals and beliefs of American conservatism to the student body of UF and residents of the Gainesville area.
