**ACCENT Speakers Bureau Presents an Immigration Debate Featuring:
Jerome Corsi and Juan Andrade**

GAINESVILLE, Fla. —ACCENT Speakers Bureau will hold an immigration debate between Dr. Jerome Corsi, author of the book “Minutemen: The Battle to Secure America’s Borders,” and Juan Andrade, President of the US Hispanic Leadership Institute, on Wednesday, Nov. 28, in the Reitz Union Grand Ballroom. The debate begins at 8 p.m. and doors open at 7 p.m. The show is free and open to the public.

Corsi, with a Ph.D. in political science from Harvard University, has authored and co-authored several books. “Minutemen: The Battle to Secure America’s Borders” heavily criticizes President Bush’s lack of enforcement of border protection laws, and for Bush’s support of the creation of a North American Union. Corsi was also considered at one time a 2008 presidential candidate for the Constitution Party.

Andrade is currently the head of the United States Hispanic Leadership Institute, and is one of only two Latinos to receive the Presidential Medal for “performance of exemplary deeds to the nation.” Since the 1960s, Andrade has worked to increase the Latino presence in the United States, and to improve voter turnout for Hispanic peoples.
